My journey into the art world has evolved in phases. As a child I took classes at the Corcoran Gallery of Art in Washington, DC where we worked in childrens' mediums - pastel and watercolor. Classes in school gave me experience in other mediums and techniques, all fun but not necessarily successful! By college I had decided on oil as my favorite medium.

In 2003 I moved to Sierra Vista, joined HAA, and was lucky enough to find the Wednesday morning drawing class. The gallery was then on Astro Street. We had interesting and varied models and a wonderful group of artists. These classes led to one of the highlights of my life - workshops with Jean Chambers and Tom Black. I have to admit to playing hooky from work one day so I wouldn't miss any of the class!

My luck held when in 2018 a friend took me to Mary Martin's oil class. Mary taught us composition and values, how to create and interpret the story behind the painting and how to paint the story onto the canvas. I have been studying with Mary for the past five years and I am eternally grateful to her for her generosity in sharing her knowledge with all of us.

As with anything in life, learning art is ongoing and I am thoroughly enjoying the ride!

I grew up in a small country town in Texas. As a child I loved chasing butterflies, listening to the wind blow through the pines, picking wildflowers, and trying to catch birds. I truly loved and still love the beauty in nature. When I wasn't outside enjoying nature, I'd spend hours in my room painting little childhood masterpieces with my small set of watercolors. My daddy would go to the newspaper office and get end rolls of paper for me to paint and sketch on.

I've had a love for art since I was a little girl. When I was in my second year of high school, my oldest sister found an art teacher and we began taking private lessons for oil painting. She said it had been Daddy's wish before he died that I take painting lessons. I instantly loved it! I took lessons for two to three years.







The applicant must be a graduating senior residing in one of either the Sierra Vista, Benson, St. David, Bisbee, or Tombstone School Districts, who will be enrolled and majoring in a visual arts program at a college, technical, or trade school for at least one full year, starting no later than the Fall semester, 2024.
- 2. The applicant must submit a portfolio of 5-8 pieces of artwork for evaluation by the Huachuca Art Association's Scholarship Committee, and must certify that the art is his or her own original work. The work, along with the completed application should be delivered to the HAA Gallery and Art Center location at 1835 Paseo San Luis, Sierra Vista, 85635 during regular business hours (Tuesday through Saturday, 11am-5pm) and may be picked up when the selection is over. If that time is not convenient, email me, Liz Horning at: Lhorningfa19@gmail.com , or call me at 520-803-7157 to make other arrangements.
- 3. The applicant must submit an essay of 300 450 words explaining why he or she wants to major in art and describing his or her career objectives.
- 4. The applicant must provide three reference letters, at least one of which must be from a faculty member who is familiar with the applicant's educational background, skills, and academic record.
- 5. The applicant must be a legal resident of Arizona.

advanced Drawing Classes

1st Sunday will be a lecture and micro study. **2nd Sunday** will be a still life or live clothed model. **3rd Sunday** will be a continuation of the last class. **No Class on the last Sunday of every month.** *HAA uses this day to hang new work.*

Class will take a deep dive into mastery level techniques with more advanced topics such as planar shapes, 3pt perspective and the nature of light; refraction, fresnel, inverse square law and reflected highlights.

Students would be encouraged to build a portfolio of sketches to show their growth. This class promises to be a challenge for those looking to make a noticeable improvement in their skills.

- 1 large pad of mixed media paper, Bristol or drawing paper Vine charcoal
