Happy March, Artyfolks!

Another spring is almost here and the March hares are getting frisky again. As the official Covid numbers continue to decline, I'm daring to think that maybe sometime soon this cursed pestilence will be gone. But I think I said the same thing at about this time last year, and we all know how that turned out. So again, it ain't over 'til it's over. We need to continue exercising caution, all the while working to get our lives back to normal.

If you haven't already done so, there still may be time to check out the Open Judged Show at the gallery until February 26. The show looks great, and the reception/open house was very well attended. And we made some good sales. Most of the sold pieces will remain on display until the show's over, and there's plenty of fine work to be seen. My thanks go out to Teresa Ebbs, Robin Lara, and the gallery hanging crew for all the work they did to make it happen. Congratulations to all those who won prizes or ribbons, myself included (hooray me!). It's good to win, but not winning can be an even better learning experience. At least that's what I always tell myself when I don't win.

As of yet, we haven't received any submissions for the Art in the Park insert/poster contest, and this year's deadline is March 30. If that date seems to be earlier than usual, it's because we've decided that it would be best to get the design done sooner, so we'll have it in time for use in the early advertising. As always, we'll be looking for designs that are BRIGHT and BOLD with GOOD CONTRAST – something that looks good up close, but also reads from across the room. Since the cover of the Herald insert is pretty much square, and the posters will be mostly vertical, the winning design needs to be adaptable to both formats. That's a problem that can usually be solved just by varying the placement and size of the lettering, so I'd say, the best approach would be to "think square", and don't worry much about the lettering unless the letters themselves are an integral part of the design. Photoshop and/or the Herald art department can do the rest. You'll find more contest information elsewhere in this Artyfacts, and there's a folder at the desk in the gallery with copies of inserts from the past that you might find inspirational, if just the idea of the prize money doesn't do it for you.

As the pandemic fades, we are planning to get back to hosting more receptions, demos, and open house events, beginning with an open house on March 5 and a reception on April 2 for featured artist Sean Yetarian. Then, on April 23, Mary Ann Kozel will make a presentation designed to get the artistic juices flowing, and that may serve as an intro to a future series of workshops based on Julia Cameron's classic book, "The Artists' Way." The introductory program will be free and open to members and the general public as well, but the subsequent workshops will be open to members only.

Which again reminds me to remind you that the HAA dues for 2022 must be paid by March 1 or you will no longer be entitled to members' privileges. If you are a "Lifetime" member, you don't have to pay, but please do fill out a membership form and send it in anyway so we can keep your contact information current.

This is the design that we will also be using for our posters and all of the other AitP advertising material for 2022. This is our 50th show. We are looking for an image that is bold, bright, and colorful and that evokes the spirit of Art in the Park. There will be lettering on the final version of the design, but unless you choose to use some lettering as an integral part of the design, you do not need to bother with it at all, beyond maybe indicating where it might go. You can do your design either digitally or with tranditional media. If you choose to do it digitally, the file size needs to be large enough to produce a good print as a 11x17 size. If it is done with traditional media, you will need to be able to submit either the original art or a high resolution photo of it.
