Featured Artist for May & June James Mustard

"James Mustard was born and raised in southern Arizona. He spent much of his early childhood growing up on cattle ranches and exploring the Sonoran Desert. After high school, James went into the army, got his G.I. bill, and later went to University of Arizona to study a variety of subjects. The subjects he studied included art, foreign languages and archaeology. After college, he worked as a botanist, and archaeologist, traveled to Mexico, worked with humanitarian groups on the US/Mexico border, and became a school teacher. His passion has always been painting, as he enjoys painting southwestern landscapes and various other subjects. James' style blends folk art traditions with abstract techniques and other styles. Some of his influences are Ted DeGrazia, a famous southwestern artist, and the works of Jack Otterson, who painted abstract still life and landscapes. James' work teaches people about the history of the southwest, while preserving the memory of unspoiled landscapes that he remembers from his youth."

If you think that this might be a not too subtle way of getting people to pony up their membership dues, you would not be entirely wrong about that.

Of course, we're hoping you'll pay up anyway, whether you enter the show or not. This past year has been such a challenge for us financially, due to the fact that we had to cancel last year's Art in the Park. We are so grateful to all of the people who have continued to support us throughout this woeful time, in spite of the fact that, with all the closures and restrictions, we have been unable to offer as much in the way of activities and benefits as we've always done. But better days are coming, October is right around the corner, we are absolutely on track for Art in the Park, and looking forward to a splendid year. Lois Bravo is taking applications for vendors. 

HAA COLORING BOOK PROJECT

We are looking for artists to produce line drawings suitable for a coloring book – one that we can print up and offer for sale as a fundraiser at the gallery, and perhaps online and in other venues as well. The book will measure 8.5 x 11, and so the pictures need to be done in sizes roughly proportional to that, but the art may be done larger, and then sized to fit. The drawings should be done in black ink or marker, in either a vertical or horizontal format. We'd especially like to see lots of drawings with a Southern Arizona flavor, but also would like to have a variety of subjects, in different styles, and varying degrees of difficulty. It has been suggested that some might be done in a kind of doodling, geometric or "zentangle" style. They might be totally abstract, or depictions of landscapes, wildlife, birds, insects, reptiles, still life subjects, etc. They could be done in either a stylistic or realistic manner, or even linear or decorative versions of the artist's previous artworks. If you google "coloring books" online, you can find lots of ideas for subject matter and styles, but it is very important that these drawings be your own original artwork. We cannot use anything that might result in copyright issues. We have not yet set a deadline for submissions, but we may start putting the first book together as soon as we have enough to work with.

Obviously, since this is a fundraiser, we won't be paying for the designs, but here's a fine opportunity for members to make a non-cash contribution to the HAA. This class will introduce participants to the copper foil method of stained glass. Students will learn to design, cut, foil and solder stained glass.


