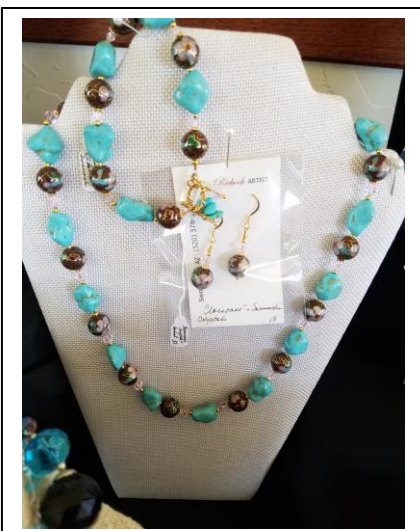
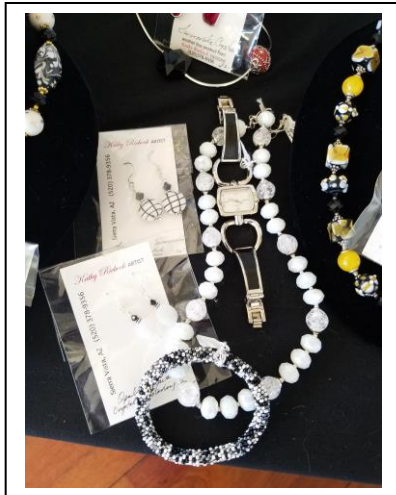

Every day is a learning and teaching experience and a way to learn and perfect your craft.

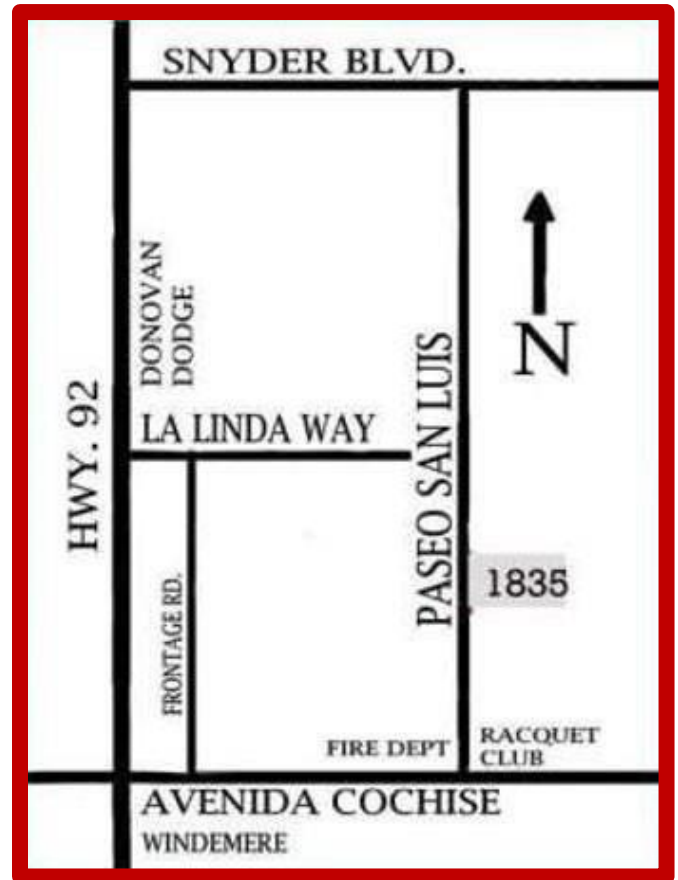

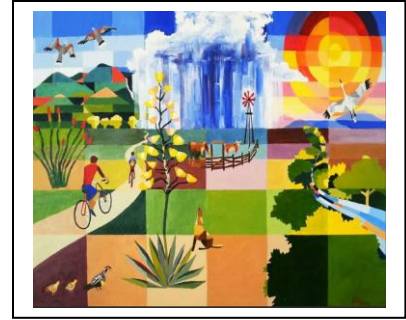

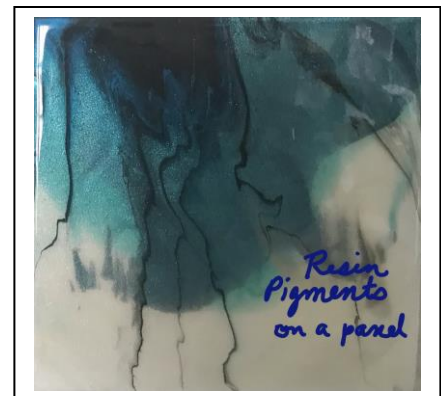
RESIN CLASS with Darlene -class cost \$50. May 27th 11 to 5

This is a class that is going to be done on your own art, so bring 1 or 2 small to medium pieces to resin on. If you have any questions, please let me know. artsydarlene@gmail.com

I wouldn't resin on oil paint, I really don't know enough about that. Watercolor if mounted on a board, alcohol inks also mounted or on tiles and acrylic.

If you have nothing to resin bring a gessoed wood panel and I will bring some colored pigment powders and you can make a piece of art with that.

I will supply the resin and a torch and other supplies. If you have a heat gun you can bring that as well. Wear old clothes and a mask only if you want to, but not needed
