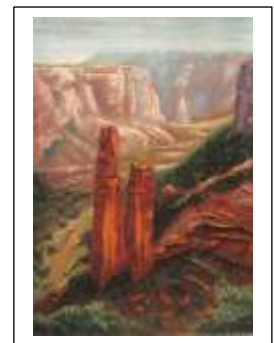

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Happy November, Artyfolks,

Ah November! Sweet November! Another Art in the Park is in the can, and a fine one it was, thanks to all of the people who worked so hard to make it happen. And this year, for the fifth time in a row, it was voted the #1 Festival in the annual "Best of the Vista" competition! So kudos to us!!! Elsewhere in this Artyfacts, you'll find a "Thank You" note from Lois, our esteemed Chairperson, to all of our valued volunteers, and I want to say, ditto to that, and also to say "Bravo" to Bravo for all the time, energy and expertise that she has brought to this endeavor. So "Bravo, Bravo! Again!"

And now, the holiday season lies lurking just around the corner, like a festive felon, waiting to help relieve us of our cash in exchange for a little bit of tinsel on the turkey, glitter in the gravy, and that warm fuzzy feeling of good will and contentment that comes with the joy of giving, the fun of receiving, and the pleasure of eating a whole lot of sinful stuff too pretty to leave on the plate. Again in the Gallery, we will be featuring special Holiday themed items, like ornaments, cards and gifts. We'll also have Layaway and Gift Certificates available as always.

But first, there is the Symphony project. The deadline for submissions is December 15, and given that we are looking for a minimum of twenty images, that doesn't leave us a whole lot of time to get it all together. While I know that at least a few of you are planning to contribute to this, we have yet to get it sorted out so that, in the end, we'll end up with all the bases covered. I recently went online to do a little research, and found a wealth of material to work with, especially on the Nutcracker. Because it is a ballet, there are a lot of photos to be found on sources like Shutterstock and Getty Images that were taken at performances, and videos on U-tube that can serve as a source of inspiration for artworks. And as long as the pictures evoke the moods of the music, we don't need to get too literal about it. In some cases we might even go with photos or abstracts. Or abstracted photos. Even sculptures. The music can also be easily found online. Many of these pieces are classics, immediately recognizable, but for others, it's helpful to have a little bit of background information, which is also available online. I've also printed out some notes on the various movements and posted them on the bulletin board in the studio. And so that we don't end up with 15 Baba Yagas, 10 Sugar Plum Fairies, and nothing else, I'll be posting a sign-up sheet there as well. If you have already started on a piece, or already know what you want to do, please put your name down on the sheet so I will know about it. If you can't make it to the gallery but still want to participate, please ask, and I can email you the information. And don't forget, the finished, framed art pieces may be available for sale the evening of the performance, so you might want to take that into consideration when planning your piece. Think standard sizes.
